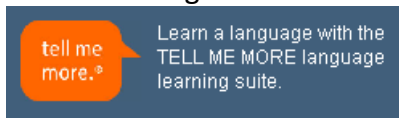


## Auralog Tell Me More® language learning software – Getting Started

### 1. Visit the MHPL Website to access Tell Me More

Access the MHPL Website by visiting <http://www.mhpl.info>  
Click the orange Tell Me More logo on the main page to get started.



### 2. Enter your 14-digit Library Card number and PIN

Your 14-digit Library card number appears below the barcode on your Library card. Ask a staff member at the Information or Reference desk if you do not know your PIN or want to set one up. Click **Login** when you are done.



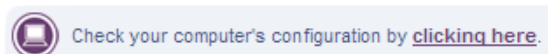

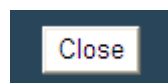

Click the link that says **clicking here** to continue. Tell Me More will then determine whether your computer meets the necessary hardware requirements.

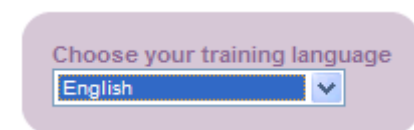


When the test is complete, click the **close** button. If you encounter difficulties with this step, consult the documents under **Technical Support** on the right side of the screen.




#### 6. Choose which language to learn



## 8. Choose your skill level or take a placement test to determine your starting level



If you do not want to take the placement test, then you can specify your own level by clicking the radio button beside the skill level that best describes you and then clicking the **Confirm** button. If you choose your own level, please skip ahead to step 10 in this guide.

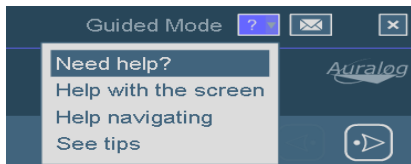

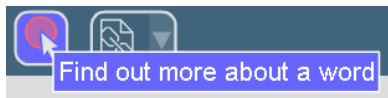
Click the title of one of these language programs to begin your training. For instance, clicking **Introduction 1** in the example above will begin the Introductory Skills language program.
